MOCAP Participation Agreement

- Students interested in taking a MOCAP course at Herculaneum High School must have attended Herculaneum High School at least one semester prior to this request and must be registered as a Herculaneum student while completing these courses.
- 2. Students will be allowed to enroll in MOCAP courses only if it is determined by the high school principal, in conjunction with the guidance counselor(s) and/or IEP team, that this is in the best educational interest of the student. Students will be notified within ten (10) business days of determination. If it is determined that this is not the best educational option for this student, they will be denied enrollment. The student and his/her guardian have the option to appeal to the board of education for reconsideration.
- 3. The Dunklin R-5 School District uses the <u>LAUNCH</u> virtual program.
- 4. Students must continue to make adequate progress in the course, or they will be dropped from the course and credit will not be granted. Progress checks will be made by the LAUNCH teacher at one-fourth, one-half, and three-fourths of the way through the semester.
- 5. Students enrolled in virtual courses are expected to complete all requirements in the time allotted for the course.
- 6. Students taking more than two courses must have an individualized learning plan (Individual Career and Academic Plan) to be created in partnership with their grade-level counselor.
- 7. If a student fails a virtual course, they cannot enroll in any other virtual courses.
- 8. Dunklin R-5 School District does not provide internet access for courses taken off campus.
- 9. Dunklin R-5 School District will provide a Chromebook for High School students. Dunklin R-5 School District will provide connectivity technical support while the student is on campus, but we will not provide technical support for the use of the learning management system used by the virtual course provider.
- 10. Full-time students wanting to participate in a virtual course will be assigned the MOCAP course in their schedule and will complete the course during a period in the library.
- 11. The virtual course teacher becomes the teacher for this course; therefore, Herculaneum teachers will not provide tutoring or assistance on coursework for these virtual courses.
- 12. The district will not pay for classes that then cause the student to exceed a normal 7-period school day for Fall and Spring courses, and a normal 2-period school day for Summer courses. Students are welcome to take these outside of school hours at their own expense.
- 13. All graduation policies regarding credit requirements and acquisition still apply.
- 14. Students taking the following courses online will be required to complete required state and local assessments on scheduled dates:
 - a. Algebra I Algebra I End of Course (EOC)
 - b. Biology I Biology I End of Course (EOC)
 - c. English II English II End of Course (EOC)
 - d. Government Government End of Course (EOC); Constitution Test (offered on campus)
 - e. American History Civics Test (offered on campus)
- 15. AP Courses will be weighted.
- 16. Students must meet the MOCAP registration deadlines set by the district:

a. Fall semester: March 31b. Spring semester: November 1c. Summer semester: April 30
