# **From the Central Office**

We hope that this edition of the Blackcat News finds us in warmer weather and well on our way to Spring! We would like to take this opportunity to inform our patrons of our new Strategic Plan, how it was developed, and what this means for our district going forward. We are excited about this plan and how the strategic planning process is changing how we do "business" as a district.

We developed a CSIP (Comprehensive School Improvement Plan) a few years back. This plan, while it was developed with patron and staff input and includes some good things, is very broad in scope- just as the name suggests. While we do have to address all areas of the District and improving in each one, the only true way to see continuous improvement and move our district from good to great is by prioritizing our biggest needs and bringing a laser-sharp focus to those areas when it comes to allocating our time and resources. Our CSIP does not do this for us, but our new Strategic Plan and the ongoing strategic planning and review process does.

How was this plan developed? Over the last year, we have strived to give each and every stakeholder in our district a voice in its development. We started with a baseline assessment that included interviews of 267 employees, and conducted focus groups and surveys to give each stakeholder (students, parents, community members & employees) a voice in telling us what we are doing well, and what our opportunities for improvement are. This information was then compiled, analyzed, and used to develop goals, objectives, and strategies by a committee for each identified area: Student Achievement, Stakeholder Engagement, Workforce Focus, Organizational Sustainability, and Financial Sustainability. The baseline study and feedback report can be found on our website at www.dunklin.k12.mo.us. The new strategic plan will also be available on the website after the final version is approved by the Board of Education.

We want to stress that the development of this plan is only the beginning of a new path for Dunklin R-5 on our "Journey



# **Blackcats Reaching Academic Goals "B.R.A.G."**

In order to meet the district's mission of "Educating today for a better tomorrow," the Dunklin R-5 Administration, in conjunction with area churches, proposed to implement an after school-tutoring program for at risk elementary students. The vision and foundation of the program were developed over the course of the 2013-2014 school year. In September 2014, the school district then hired a Program Director, who develops and maintains the program, alongside B.R.A.G board members.


On October 28, 2014, a select group of Pevely Elementary students were identified for the after school program. The focus of the tutoring program is to diminish the achievement gap and to promote reading comprehension through the use of the school wide Lexia Reading Program.

Since then, the B.R.A.G. committee has routinely met to focus energy into recruiting staff members, as the need in each grade level continues to grow. Currently, the forty-six students, consisting of 3rd, 4th and 5th graders, attend the tutoring program two days a week, from 4:00-5:00, and have assistance with the reading supplemental program and homework. The B.R.A.G program is primarily run by volunteers of district staff members, community church congregations, high school A+ tutors, and community volunteers.

As the interest of participating students continues to grow, the need for volunteers will grow. If you are interested in being a part of B.R.A.G., please contact Mrs. Dalania Watson (dwatson@dunklin.k12.mo.us) at Pevely Elementary for more information. Each volunteer, if not employed by the district, will be required to pass a thorough background check and complete a 45-minute training session with the director, prior to attending the program.

# **STMS Staff Member Inducted into Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame**

Mr. Pat Bone is a 1977 graduate of Crystal City High School. He continued his athletic career at Waldorf College in Forest City, Iowa, where he played baseball and basketball. He was inducted into the Waldorf College Hall of Fame in 2009. After Waldorf, he played baseball at Florida International University in Miami Florida, where he set an NCAA record with 7 hits in 7 at-bats in a game. He was a 17th round draft pick by the New York Yankees in 1981, and played in the Yankees minor league organization, winning the New York-Penn League Championship in 1981.

He began coaching the Festus American Legion team in 1991 as an assistant coach, and took over the program beginning in 1992. From 1991-2011, his teams captured 5 Missouri State Championships, including 3 in a row from 2009-2011. His 2009 team captured the American Legion Central Plains Regional Championship en route to a 5th place finish at the American Legion World Series in Fargo, North Dakota. Over 100 of his former players went on to play at the college level, with a half dozen more signing professional contracts.

Pat will be inducted into the St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame on April 16, 2015. He will join his father Ron, a 1995 inductee in the Hall of Fame. Mr. Bone joined the Senn-Thomas family this school year as a Para-Educator. He has proven to be an incredible asset to our students and our district.

# Letter from the High School Administration

It is hard to believe the end of the third quarter is approaching and we will soon conduct parent/teacher conferences. This year we are doing a student-led conference with parents. The purpose of this type of conference is to allow the students to lead the conversations and discuss their coursework with their parents. Students will set up times to meet with their parents. They will present their tests, homework assignments, and projects for each class to their parents. The students will discuss these artifacts as well as how they are doing in their classes. The student-led conference is an excellent opportunity for students to really discuss their classes and how they are performing in them.

We have already missed several days this school year due to inclement weather. Because of the days we have missed the school calendar for this year has changed. All changes to the schedule can be found on the Dunklin R-V School District website.

This year every 11th grade student in all public schools in the state of Missouri will take the American College Test (ACT). This test is used to determine a student's academic readiness for college. This test will be given to all juniors, at no cost to the student, the morning of April 28. It is important students give their best effort on the ACT as it can be beneficial for them when looking at attending college in the future.

Another important time for the end of the year is End of Course (EOC) testing. EOCs are mandatory state assessments in certain core area subjects. These tests are part of a student's grade as well as an indicator into the effectiveness of instruction that is delivered to students in these core area subjects.

Commencement is one of the most special events in a person life. This event is a time for families to celebrate the accomplishment of their children. There will be information for seniors concerning graduation in the coming weeks. Seniors must make sure they are aware of and attend any meetings and to contact the office if they are absent the day of a meeting.

I hope everyone has a wonderful end of the year, and if you have any questions, feel free to contact the high school at 636-479-5200. We want to do everything we can to help your children succeed.

- If you are anxious about your child's test, it's ok but try to keep cool around your child, you don't want them to get anxious about the tests too.
- © Encourage your child to do well but don't pressure him/her. You may stress him/her out. It is important for your child to stay relaxed for the test.
- Seep a positive attitude about tests.
- Image: Mark test days on your calendar so you and your child are both aware of testing dates.
- ③ Make sure that your child gets enough sleep the night before the test.



ACT Plus Writing - \$54.50. This test includes reports for you, your high school, and up to four college choices (if valid codes are provided when you register). The \$16.00 Writing Test fee is refundable, on written request, if you are absent on test day or switch to the ACT (No Writing) before testing begins.

Herculaneum students who earn a composite score of 21 or higher are eligible for fee reimbursement for the \$38.00. If you score 21 or higher, please see the high school office.
